Final rites were Wednesday for Joseph diBenegetto, 95, well-known Bay St. Louis resident and retired grocery store owner, who died Tuesday in Hancock General Hospital where he had been a patient since Sunday.

A native of Palermo, Sicily, where he was born on Jan. 13, 1871, Mr. diBenedetto was a naturalized United States citizen and lived in Bay St. Louis for the last 66 years. At the time of his death he was residing at 123 S. Beach Blvd.

Mr. and Mrs. diBenedetto moved to Bay St. Louis in 1900 from Independence, La., and started in busitess raising strawberries. It was he who first introduced the Klondike berry to Hancock County. The couple later opened a grocery store on Beach Boulevard and were famous for their fine quality Kansas City meats.
