Mrs. Mary Jane Redmond Green Dies

Mrs. Mary Jane Redmond Green, wife of John A. Green, Sr., died at her home 418 South Beach Boulevard on Sunday, October 21 at 1 o'clock a. m. Funeral services were held Tuesday morning with a Requiem Mass at Our Lady of the Gulf Catholic Church, the Right Rev. Msgr. A. J. Gmelch as celebrant of the Mass and Father Leo Fahey of Hattiesburg, conducting the services at St. Mary's cemetery where she was placed in the family tomb. Pallbearers were John A. Green, III, J. T. Swoop, R. N. Habans, New Orleans; T. T. Payment, Gulfport; Lamar Otis, Logtown; W. L. Bourgeois, Sam Whitfield, George W. Hoffman, Bay St. Louis.

Mrs. Green was a native of New Orleans but resided here for more than 50 years. She raised a family of seven sons and daughters, six of whom survive her: Osmond R.; Justin A., John A. Jr.; Marion Green; Mrs. Waldo C. Otis and Mrs. Paul V. Jaubert. Her husband also survives her.

She was active in civic and church work, was Chief Ranger of the Catholic Order of Foresters, treasurer of St. Margarets Daughters and a member of the Altar Society and organist of her church for many years.

Her passing has left a place hard to fill because of her keen understanding of the needs of others and her love for people.

She was a grower of flowers and was famed for her roses and she sleeps beneath a wealth of the flowers she loved. She was one of God's good women.

There was a large number from New Orleans and Coast cities here for the funeral.
