NASH, SR.**

Andrew Herbert Nash, Sr., 69 of Waveland, MS went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, March 20, 2019 at his residence. He was a member of St. Rose de Lima Catholic Church in Bay St. Louis.

Mr. Nash was born on June 21, 1949 in New Orleans, LA and raised in Bay St. Louis, MS. He attended Dillard University, from which he earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business Administration. After college, he enlisted in the Army and was assigned to the Fourth Division at Fort Carson, CO. Upon leaving the Army, he returned to his beloved New Orleans, where he worked for Tenneco Oil Company before being accepted into the FBI Academy at Quantico, VA. As a Special Agent, Mr. Nash served in the Jacksonville, FL, New York, NY and Boston, MA bureau offices before transferring to his office of preference in New Orleans, where he was promoted to Supervisory Special Agent. He retired in 2004, after twenty-five years of service.

After retiring from the



FBI, Mr. Nash became a drug program agent for the National Football League (NFL), conducting drug testing in their Southern region, which included Louisiana, Mississippi, Southern Alabama and the Florida Panhandle.

After four years with the NFL, he retired permanently and returned to the Bay-Waveland area, where he became civically involved, serving as Vice President of the St. Rose de Lima Parish Council, President of the St. Vincent de Paul Conference and as a member of the board of directors for the Hancock County Human Resources Agency and the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Hancock County. He was also a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., Society of Former Special Agents of the FBI, Federal Bureau of Investigation Agents Association, National Association of

Retired Federal Employees, Southern Poverty Leadership Conference and the American Legion.

He is preceded in death by his parents Herbert A. and Louise Curry Nash.
