Martin G Fagot unexpectedly passed away Friday Oct 20, 2017 at his residence at the age of 76.

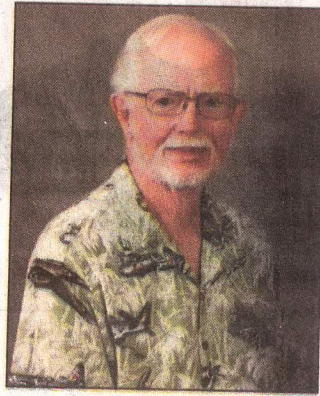
He was preceded in death by his parents, Gilbert P. and Mary M (Martin) Fagot and a nephew Mitchell Lasley.

He was a civil servant working for the Navy Department. He concluded his 28 year career retiring in 1994 from the Naval Research Laboratory at the Stennis Space Center in Ms.

He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from New Mexico State University (NMSU) in 1966. He went on under a Navy sponsored program to receive his Master's degree in Ocean Engineering from the University of Rhode Island in 1971.



In 1963, while attending NMSU, he earned a private pilots license and followed his love of aviation for many years. He started constructing an experimental aircraft in 1976 and completed construction by soloing the aircraft in 1987.

After retiring he enjoyed traveling with his dear companion Carole Allen. He pursued photography and generated many home movies. These movies (DVD's) are enjoyed by family, friends and a group of coffee drinking buddies collectively known as "The Boys". He enjoyed many hours of walking and hiking with a dear friend Michael Harris.
