**FUNERAL SERVICE
FOR MRS. G. Y. BLAIZE
TO BE HELD TODAY**

Mrs. Catherine Spotorno Blaize, wife of Mayor G. Y. Blaize died at the Touro Infirmary in New Orleans, on Wednesday evening, December 10th., at 8:45, following an acute illness.

Daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Louis Spotorno, she had been a life-long resident of Bay St. Louis.

Mrs. Blaize was very active in all civic and church work. Her charities knew no bounds. She loved to spend her time doing and giving aid to those who needed assistance.

She was President of the St. Margarets Daughters, Past President of the National Council of Catholic Women, and was a former officer of the Bay Garden Club and the Kings

Daughters. She was chairman of production of the local chapter of the American Red Cross and worked untiringly during the war years.

Surviving her are her husband Mayor G. Y. Blaize, four sons, Louis and G. Y. Jr., both of Dallas, Texas, Bernard and Edward of Bay St. Louis; also four sisters, Mrs. Adele Bordelon and Mrs. Mercedes Firment of Marksville, La.; Mrs. Judith Bordelon of Bordelonville, La., and Miss Carmelite Spotorno of Bay St. Louis, and three Brothers, Louis N. Spotorno of Bay St. Louis, Humbert Spotorno of Marksville, La., and Bartholomew Spotorno of Memphis.

She is also survived by six grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted this Friday morning from the home on Hancock Street, with a requiem Mass at the Church of Our Lady of the Gulf at 10:00, with interment in St. Mary's Cemetery.
