PLANTING

do not plant your citrus trees and grapevines in the ground so soon as you do so as soon as possible. Be sure that you get plants that are adapted to the climate.

... of trees and vines should be done during planting and during planting on a cloudy day, so that they do not dry out if left exposed for just a few minutes.

... deep and large holes for the tree one to two feet deeper than they are in the nursery and so that the roots spread out in a natural position. Use topsoil around the roots and pack as you fill the hole. The soil should be dry, thoroughly around the roots.
